

Our History



1990 - Measure 5 Passes
The passing of Oregon Ballot Measure 5 lowers property tax rates, significantly increasing the need for alternative school funding for PPS.

1995 - First Roast Festival Held
With a deep commitment to rallying the community around funding education, U.S. Congressman Earl Blumenauer (pictured with then-Multnomah County Chair Bev Stein) leads the establishment of an annual fundraising event.

1994 - Portland Public Schools Foundation Is Established
The PPSF stewards the funds raised by Local School Foundations and manages the PPSF Equity Fund, in accordance with PPS School Board policy, passed on May 12, 1994.

1996 - March for Our Schools
Community leaders galvanized around the disinvestment in our schools, encouraging more than 30,000 participants to "take to the streets."

2001 - First Principal for Almost a Day Event
This annual event is established as a way to build greater understanding of and connection between schools and community leaders.

2003 - Connected by 25
Connected by 25 (Cx25) launches a community initiative to bridge program and policy in an effort to get all students connected to school, work, and their community by the age of 25.

2002 - Sponsored Projects
Short term Sponsored Projects like First Octave, Eat. Think. Grow. and Schoolhouse Supplies are established. Schoolhouse Supplies spins off as its own nonprofit in 2008.

2007 - Release of The Fourth R
This Cx25 report shows which academic indicators are the best predictors of high school graduation and what interventions might help more kids graduate.

2008 - Expands to Include Six School Districts
The organization grows to incorporate six districts as partners - Centennial, David Douglas, Gresham-Barlow, Parkrose, Portland Public Schools and Reynolds.

2008 - Ninth Grade Counts Is Established
As a result of Cx25 data, this first Collaborative Action Team launches to increase graduation rates by supporting summer learning and keeping more kids on track through the transition to high school.

2010 - Joins Cradle To Career Initiative
The organization joins the original StriveTogether network of 5 community partnerships committed to supporting the success of every child from cradle to career.

2013 - Release of Chapter 01
All Hands Raised releases Chapter 01, the first chapter of the work is framed and initial data on the twelve Community-Wide Indicators is put forth.

2011 - Name Changed to All Hands Raised
Through conversations with hundreds of people across Multnomah County, PPSF was rebranded as All Hands Raised to reflect the newly expanded scope of work.

2012 - Initial Collaborative Action Teams Launched
These Teams join Ninth Grade Counts to address:

- Early Learning
- K-12 Attendance
- Eliminating Disparities in Child & Youth Success

2015 - New Work Focused on High School to College and Career
The initial work is focused on FAFSA completion and strengthening the pathways to skilled trades.

2015 - Release of Chapter 02
All Hands Raised releases Chapter 02, which highlights the early progress being made through the All Hands Raised Partnership.
